Background

Disability Facts & Figures

There are 14.1 million disabled people in the UK. *

19% of working age adults are disabled *

Disabled people are twice as likely to be unemployed than nondisabled people. **

By the age of 26, disabled people are four times more likely to be out of work or not in education, compared to non-disabled people. **

1 in 5 employers say they would be less likely to employ a disabled person. **

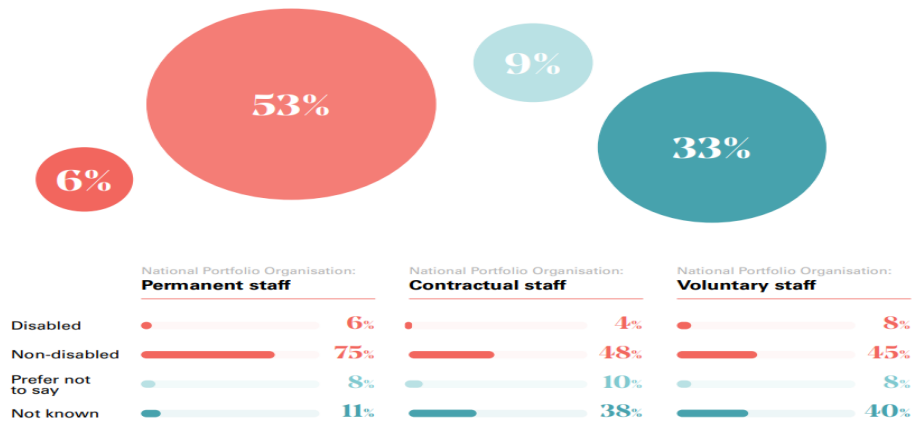

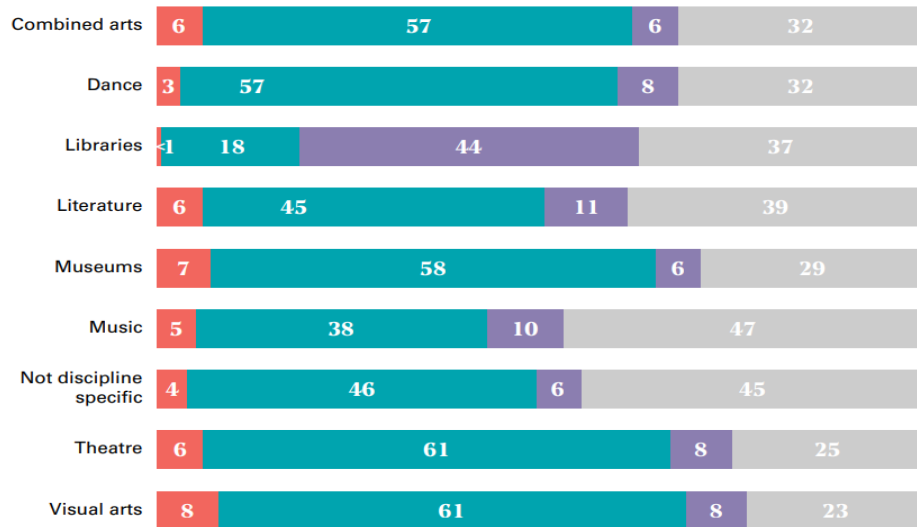
National Portfolio Organisation: All staff

How did it come about?

One area of focus for us is to broaden our audiences and deepen our engagement with people who have protected characteristics and/or come from lower socio-economic backgrounds.

To do this we recognise we also need to increase the diversity of our workforce.

Partnership with Beacon Films established in 2019 when they created a film for our Planetarium at Great North Museum. Project allowed participants to develop their media work skills. (Cosmic Unknown)

This prompted us to think about how we could go further due to our responsibilities and commitments as an employer and in partnership we created a paid work placement.

How could it be developed further – Recruitment/ HR Actions

- We are a Disability Confident employer. Increase awareness of this and work towards lead employer status
- Further improving our recruitment processes
- Looking at language in our adverts, JD and PS (updating Accessible Information Guidelines currently)
- Looking at how to widen our applicant pool
- Educating our recruiting managers particularly in the area of neurodiversity
- Additional placement support e.g. CV / interview skills for staff completing placements to support continuing employment
- Improving our data collection and monitoring processes
- Improving our support to our current workforce
