

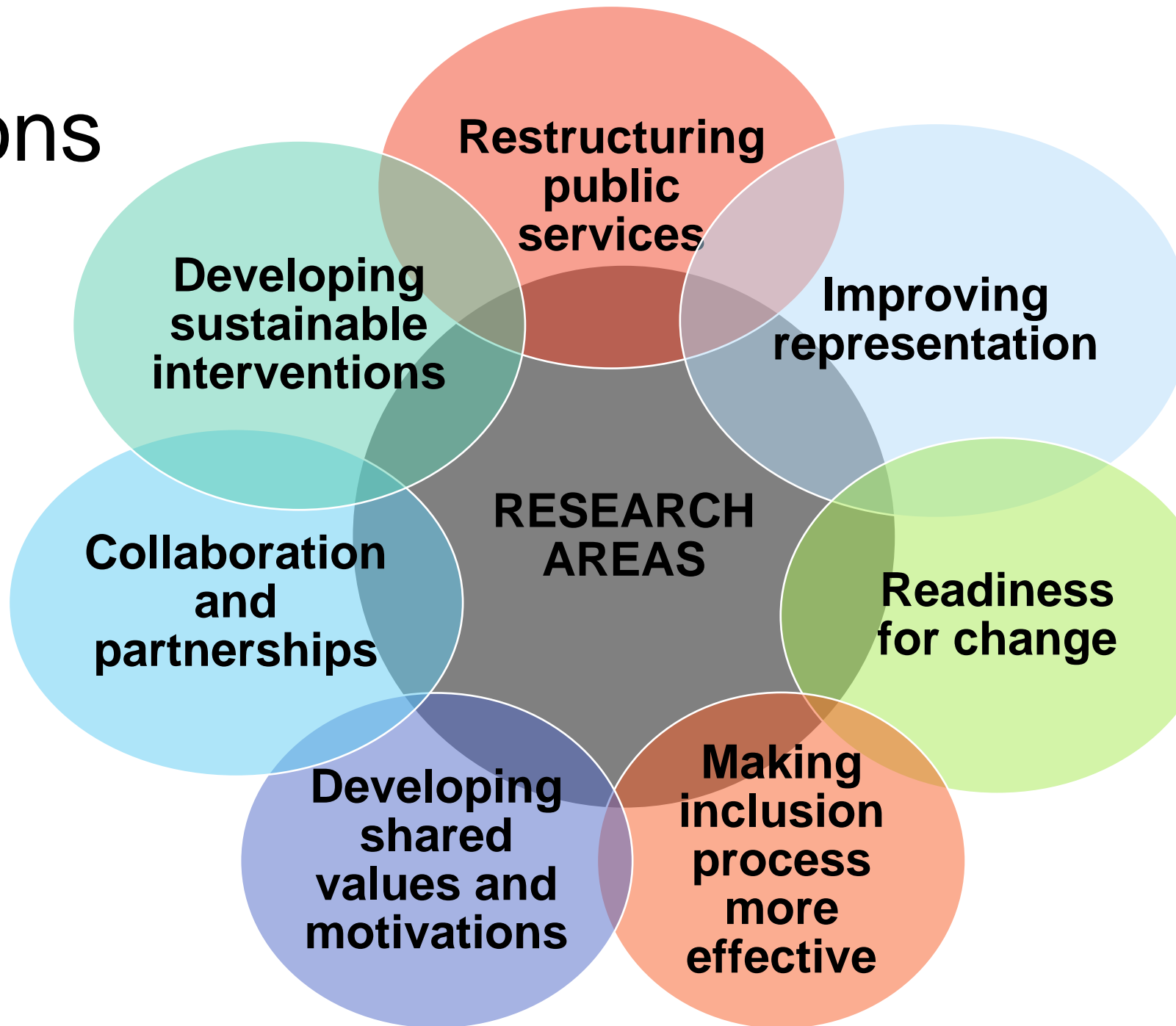
Partnerships for Social Justice

Identified directions

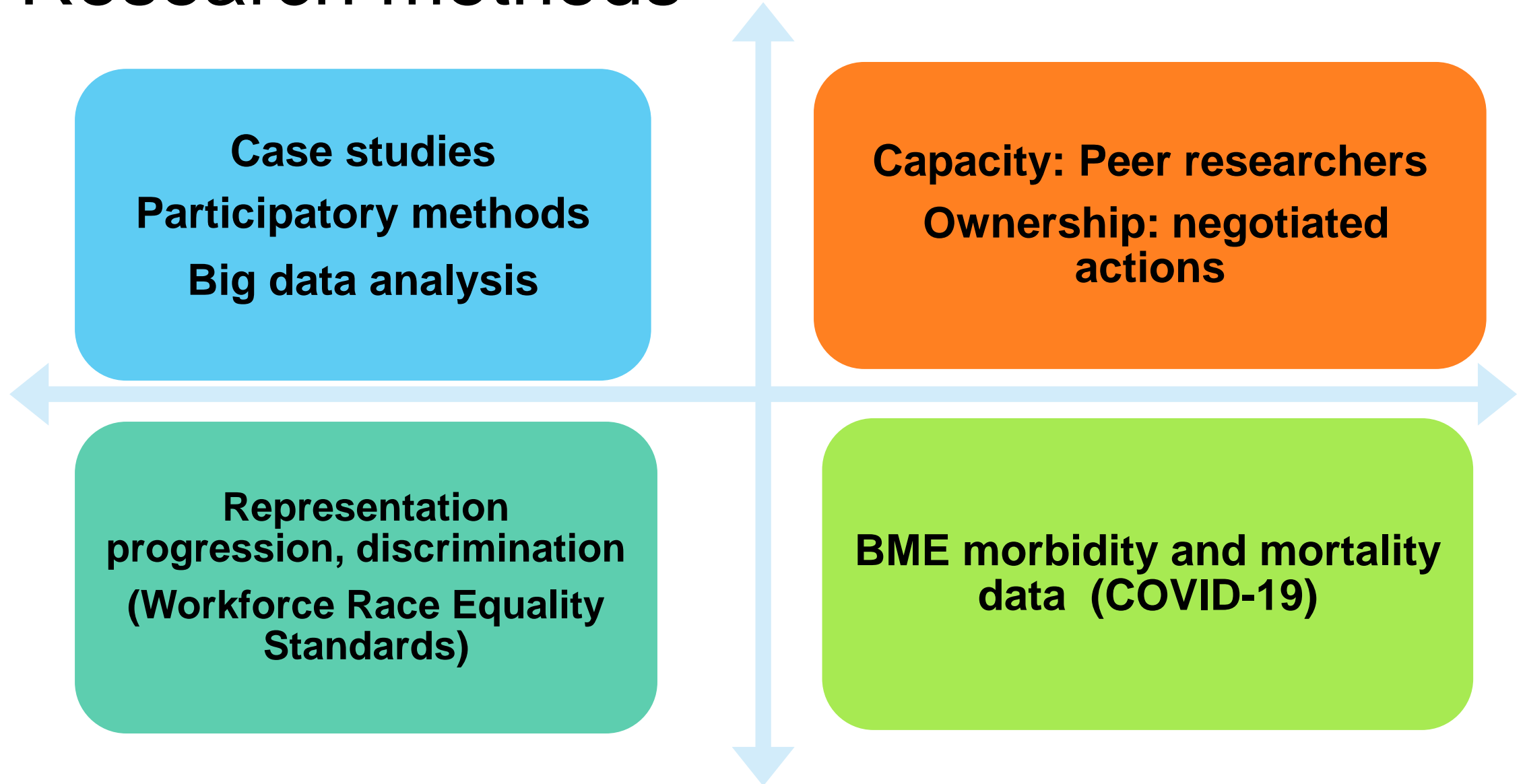
- **Seven key themes for future research areas**
- **Building on good practice that already exists**
- **Combining research needs from policy and practice with academic experience and funding opportunities - multisector partners**



“Can BME staff networks support organisations managing the Covid-19 pandemic to reduce inequities in the impact on BME staff and populations?”

- **Criteria for BME staff networks to effectively support COVID-19 policymaking** - developed in primary and secondary healthcare and civil service networks
- **Implement coproduced action plans** to develop existing networks
- **Identify associations between BME staff networks, WRES indicators and COVID-19 outcomes** for BME staff and communities in 6 healthcare organisations (NHS Confederation)
- **Good practice examples of organisational engagement with BME staff networks** aimed at reducing the higher risks of morbidity and mortality to BME staff and communities.

Place based approaches

- Public Sector Equality Duty/ economic development strategies as levers for action
- Multi-sector/whole system approach; restructuring services
- Involving excluded groups in decision-making; coproduction, representation in policymaking
- Links/alignment between community, institutional and policy level initiatives
- Use of routine and innovative data
- Matching action to current evidence - identifying policy/practice gaps
