- "Can BME staff networks support organisations managing the Covid-19 pandemic to reduce inequities in the impact on BME staff and populations?"
- Criteria for BME staff networks to effectively support COVID-19 policymaking - developed in primary and secondary healthcare and civil service networks
- Implement coproduced action plans to develop existing networks
- Identify associations between BME staff networks, WRES indicators and COVID-19 outcomes for BME staff and communities in 6 healthcare organisations (NHS Confederation)
- Good practice examples of organisational engagement with BME staff networks aimed at reducing the higher risks of morbidity and mortality to BME staff and communities.
